The College team has over 20 years' experience of providing education to international students. Our team of hard-working staff are passionate about providing a positive and caring environment for all students.

The campus offers a safe and secure location with high quality teaching and residential facilities. Student accommodation are well appointed shared rooms all with en-suite bathrooms. The spacious rooms at the campus are homely, calm and welcoming with windows overlooking the gardens.

All students are supervised throughout their stay by an experienced team of managers, teachers, pastoral staff and residential supervisors. There are fast and reliable transport links to Cambridge, London and beyond. Students wishing to visit London can take a train from Cambridge and there in under an hour.

GCSE is an intermediate, academically rigorous, internationally used, and specialized English language curriculum which is offered to students to prepare them for advanced level study, for example, A level or the International Baccalaureate. It is based on the GCE O-Level and is recognized as being equivalent to the GCSE. The IGCSE is based on individual subjects of study, which means that students receive an "IGCSE" qualification for each subject they take. This programme prepare students for IGCSE

We offer a wide range of IGCSE subjects in three academic disciplines, viz: Humanities, Sciences and the Arts.

Humanities for Business, Humanities and Law students: mathematics, English Language, Double Science, Business Studies, History.

Sciences for Scientists and Engineers: mathematics (Higher), English Language, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Geography.

Arts for fine and applied artists: mathematics, English Language, Art, English Literature, Double Science.

Entry Requirements:

- Normally must be at least 12 years old on 1st September of the year entry
- Applicants are required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language before they are admitted to CMC through possession of a recognised English language qualification at IELTS 4.5 (overall band score), or equivalent
- Complete the CMC application form
- Parental consent form (students under 18)
- Copies of latest/most recent academic report
- Copies of all relevant certificates, including IELTS or Cambridge English Certificates
- Copy of passport
- Good educational references - including attendance (relating to previous 2 years)
- Meet UKVI financial requirements
- Successful interview: Must evidence high levels of motivation and commitment, as these are vital for successful completion of these courses
